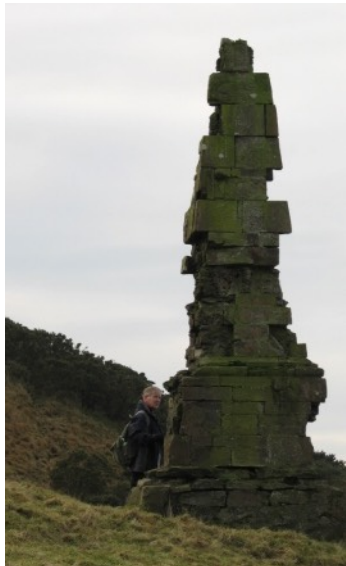


Parish Walk 11 - the Byne Hill - 12 Jan 2013
